My dear parishioners and friends,

Amid the outbreak and spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) in our region, St. Matthew's is taking the actions outlined in this letter in response to the March 12, 2020 statement of Archbishop Gregory for the Archdiocese of Washington. In response to public health recommendations from local government leaders regarding the potential spread of the virus and the Archbishop's response, beginning on Saturday, March 14, celebration at the Cathedral of Masses, Confessions (including Wednesday evening Lenten Confessions), Lenten Stations of the Cross and other public liturgies will be suspended until further notice. During this time, the Cathedral will not open.

Archbishop Gregory has issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass during this time to all parishioners of the Archdiocese of Washington.

I and all the priests, deacons and staff members of St. Matthew's share the feelings of sadness, buoyed by faith and hope, at this decision expressed by Archbishop Gregory: "We are profoundly saddened that we are not able to celebrate our sacraments as a community for the time being, but we know Christ remains with us at all times - specifically in times of worry like this."

Let us pray for a swift resumption of our celebration of the Eucharist and our other liturgies!
